

The "Confidence Gap"

In a UC Santa Barbara study, social psychologist Brenda Major found that:

“Men consistently *overestimated* their abilities and subsequent performance, and... women routinely *underestimated* both. The actual performances did not differ in quality.”

Why It Matters: STEM Pipeline

...About as many girls as boys leave high school prepared to pursue science and engineering majors in college... Among first-year college students, women are much less likely than men to say that they intend to major in [STEM]... By graduation, men outnumber women in nearly every science and engineering field.

Stereotyping

...There are many groups on Facebook and Reddit dedicated to troubleshooting 3D printing projects... If the person asking the question is male, they'll receive helpful advice virtually 100% of the time. Not so if you're a woman... Women who post questions are often dismissed with comments such as: "Your learning curve is quite steep. You should find a guy in your area with electronics knowledge who can help you. LOL!"



Stereotype Threat

- You are vulnerable to underconfidence when a cultural stereotype can explain perceived shortcomings, *even if you consciously reject that stereotype.*
- Awareness of this phenomenon seems to help reduce the effect.
- So does affirmation of your strengths.


